Items requested and for sale include: Furniture such as couches, tables, desks, lamps, beds, futons, mirrors, armoires, lawn furniture; Rugs and Curtains; Electronics such as laptops, televisions, stereos and speakers, DVD players and DVD's in original covers; Artwork; Antiques; Small Appliances like microwaves and small refrigerators; Children's items including bicycles, toys, strollers and cribs and clothes.
